BSOM Annual Scientific Meeting 2004

Welcome to Manchester

Manchester as a Venue

The Annual Scientific meeting of the British Society for Oral Medicine will take place in Manchester on Thursday 20th May and Friday 21st May 2004. On Wednesday 19th May there will be a BSOM Juniors meeting together with a meeting for 'Teachers of Human Disease for Dental Students.' Manchester is a thriving city, which has seen a resurgence in the last ten years. In 2002 the city hosted the Commonwealth Games. To coincide with the games, several cultural amenities such as the Lowry Centre, Imperial War Museum North and Urbis opened. Manchester is also the home of longer standing cultural attractions such as Manchester City and United football clubs.

The Scientific Meeting

The theme for the opening morning is Rheumatology. Three distinguished Consultant Rheumatologists practicing in Manchester will outline current knowledge and recent advances in areas of rheumatology relevant to oral medicine. These will include systemic sclerosis, vasculitis, lupus and rheumatoid arthritis. The afternoon will resurrect the 'clinical cases' section of the meeting. For this to be a success we would like as many units as possible to contribute cases. Friday morning will be given over to free papers.

The Conference Centre

The Scientific Meeting, Juniors Meeting and Meeting for Teachers of Human Disease for Dental Students will be held at **Chancellors** (www.chancellorshotel.co.uk). This is the University of Manchester dedicated hotel and conference centre. Set in five acres of mature landscape, Chancellors was originally built for Joseph Whitworth, then became the official residence of succeeding vice-chancellors before opening as a conference centre in 1997. The centre is situated three miles due south of Manchester city centre. Free parking is available for 80 cars.

Accommodation

Accommodation is available at the conference centre for 75 people. This offers purpose built single study bedrooms with en-suite facilities. These are available on a first come basis. For those wishing alternative accommodation arrangements, possibilities include

Budget: Willowbank Hotel (Chancellors, 15 minute walk)

Moderate: Didsbury House Hotel (2 miles south of chancellors. Easy access to Motorways)

Expensive: Malmaison (5 minutes walk from Piccadilly train station, city centre hotel)

Accommodation outside of the conference centre should be booked directly with the hotels themselves.

Annual Dinner

The Annual dinner will be held at the City of Manchester Art Gallery. This is located in the city centre allowing easy access to the Manchester nightlife for those who wish to take up the opportunity. Because of size restrictions at the venue, we can only accommodate 120 diners. These places will be allocated on a first come basis. Again, because of venue restrictions, it is not possible to drink red wine at the meal. Dress will be lounge suits. Transport to and from the conference centre will be provided.

Travel to Manchester

By Rail

Manchester is centrally located with services to all major cities in the UK. The recently refurbished Piccadilly station is located in the city centre.

By Air

Manchester airport is the largest in the UK outside London. It is situated to the Southwest of the city with a frequent 24-hour link by rail to the city centre.

By Car

Manchester is well provided with motorway access, with the M6 providing access from the North and South and the M62 from the East and West.

BRITISH SOCIETY FOR ORAL MEDICINE PRIZE 2004

The British Society for Oral Medicine offers two prizes to encourage research in the field of Oral Medicine:-

- i) for young workers (junior prize)
- ii) no age limit.

The regulations governing the award of the prizes are as follows:-

1. The Prizes shall be known as 'The British Society for Oral Medicine Prizes'. The value of the junior prize will be £200, the second prize has no monetary value. Entrants are required to present the papers at the Annual Meeting of the Society during the year in which the prizes are to be awarded.
2. The British Society for Oral Medicine reserves the right to withhold the award of the prize if entries are of insufficient merit.
3. Assessment for award of the prizes will be based on an essay and the verbal presentation. The subject matter must be a piece of original research which may have been previously published. The entrant must be the sole author of the competing paper, but the work may be presented on behalf of a research group. The text of the entry should be not more than 2,000 words (figures and tables may be included) and should be in the approximate form of the verbal presentation to be made at the meeting.
4. Candidates for the junior prize should be not more than 40 years of age on 1 January in the year of the award. Entrants must be fully subscribed members of the British Society for Oral Medicine. No one individual may win an award on more than one occasion, but may be eligible to win both.
5. The list of candidates will remain confidential and only the name of the winner of the award will be made public.
6. The prize shall be awarded by the Society on the recommendation of a panel of three assessors appointed annually for this purpose and such additional assessors as the Council may wish to consult. The assessors, at their discretion, may divide the prize between two candidates.
7. Entrants should submit an abstract to the local organising committee of the annual scientific meeting.
8. All applications should be sent to the Secretary at the address below. Candidates are required to submit by 23rd April.
 - Four copies of an abstract suitable for inclusion in the annual meeting programme
 - Four copies of the text of the paper
